Minutes of the DCC Meeting on 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2017 (Wednesday)

Venue: CSE 202










Time: 12.20 pm

The meeting started at 12.20 pm. Dr. Saidalavi Kalady, HOD, CSED welcomed the members to the DCC meeting. The following decisions were made

1. DCC discussed the suggestion of reducing the number of interim test. DCC agrees to the proposal and recommends that there should be only one mandatory interim test and the weightage for the end semester exam should not be more than 50%.
2. DCC discussed about the option of C/C++/Python language to be taught for the first year student. DCC ruled out the option of C++ as it is not suitable as an entry level two credit course. DCC recommends continuing instruction of C language as part of first year course.
3. DCC discussed the syllabus for life science. DCC recommends the reduction of number of text books for the course. DCC observed that course outcome has not been prepared according to the NBA guidelines.
4. DCC suggests that use of 'Q' in the course code may be avoided and existing code may be continued.
5. The department discussed the document on Guidelines for PG Curricula preparation from Institute's committee for the revision of curricula for PG Programmes. The recommendations of the department are listed below.

1. The department proposes that "Course #" as mentioned in the semester wise curriculum may be interpreted as a theory course/ a combined theory cum practical course/a practical course, and a statement be added to this effect to resolve any doubts arising in future.
2. The department agrees with the proposal for total credits as 60.
3. The department discussed about the recommendation of the committee regarding the requirement of minimum 24 credits for project. The DCC recommends that total credit of 24 should be credited as 4 credit term paper (in the third or second semesters) + a 20 credit project in the second year.
4. The department agrees on the principle of not including the grade for project work for the calculation of the CGPA, and proposes that the two scores be reported independently, as the course work CGPA and the project grade CGPA.
